DEERFIELD, Illinois, July 2, 2010 – On June 30, 2010, MSA North America Corporate Headquarters released a statement regarding their Redpoint and Auto-Belay Descenders. The communication specifically addresses concerns related to upgrades and refurbishment programs.

MSA informs affected parties that the December 23, 2009 recall notice remains in effect. MSA goes on to warn customers NOT to participate in ANY efforts to modify, upgrade, or refurbish recalled units. To do so is a violation of federal consumer product safety laws and subject to severe civil and/or criminal action.
